

June 2, 2010: The Berkeley Heights Police Department shared the following information as an update to the incident reported yesterday:

In regard to the message pertaining to the attempted luring of a 17 year old female that occurred on Tuesday, June 1, 2010 at approximately 06:55 hours on Plainfield Avenue in Berkeley Heights perpetrated by a suspect described as a Hispanic male between the ages of 30 to 40 with short black hair operating a newer white van, be advised that the van with an individual fitting the description was stopped by Berkeley Heights Police Officers at 7:30 a.m. at the intersection of Sherman and Summit Avenues in Berkeley Heights.

The suspect voluntarily returned to Police Headquarters where he was questioned by Detectives. It was determined that this individual, who delivers baked goods to local supermarkets was the suspect in question, and freely admitted to speaking with the female on June 1<sup>st</sup>. After asking for the female's telephone number and being rejected the suspect left the area. The suspect's version of the incident matched the complainant's version. After speaking with an Assistant Prosecutor at the Union County Prosecutor's Office Detectives determined that no criminal act had occurred and no charges have been filed.
