SERVICES FOR THE DEAF AND HARD OF HEARING

An array of programs and personnel are available to support and implement IEPs.

- ◆ Self-contained, resource center and regular education classes on all academic levels.
- ◆ Three years of ASL as a World Language.
- ◆ Elective classes in a wide variety of subjects.
- ◆ A Community Based Instruction (CBI) program provides the tools necessary for a successful transition from high school to post-high school programs and educational institutions.
- ◆ Teachers of the Deaf who instruct using Total Communication.
- ◆ EIPA Certified Educational Interpreters on staff.
- ◆ A speech and language specialist responsible for enhancing communication skills.
- ◆ Child study team professionals assigned to monitor each student's IEP.
- ◆ Clubs, sports and after-school activities in an inclusive setting.
- ◆ Strong auditory component to support students with Cochlear Implants.
- ◆ Shared program available with Union County Vocational Technical School.

AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE

Governor Livingston High School is the only secondary school in New Jersey to offer three years of American Sign Language (ASL) as a World Language. ASL is open to all students: hearing, deaf, and hard of hearing. The



ASL courses allow students to better understand the grammar, syntax and history of American Sign Language. In addition, the popularity of these classes has created an understanding of deafness and promoted friendships between hearing and deaf students.

Those who achieve a high level of academic success in their American Sign Language studies may also participate in the national ASL Honor Society.

ASL CLUB

The Deaf and Hard of Hearing Program at Governor Livingston has an active ASL club consisting of deaf, hard of hearing and hearing students. Under the guidance of the club's advisors, students not only plan trips and social events, but also engage in fundraising activities to benefit causes outside of the organization. Past trips have included interpreted Broadway performances and special D/HH events across New Jersey.

ENTRANCE CRITERIA

- Age 14 by October 1st for 9th grade admission
- IEP states grade 8 or higher
- PARCC is administered prior to enrollment
- Evaluations are current

At Governor Livingston High School, we strive to foster a sense of personal achievement and self worth by encouraging the development of each student's talents and interests.
