Good Afternoon,

Due to the number of students who have tested positive for COVID-19, and out of an abundance of caution, we will postpone moving to Plan A for grades 1-5 until Thursday, November 19th. While we realize it is midweek, it coincides with the 14 day quarantine period that Governor Livingston High School has to follow and it makes the district more consistent.

Kindergarten:

-Beginning the week of November 9th, AM Kindergarten students will receive in person instruction on Monday, Tuesday, and remote instruction on Wednesday afternoon. PM Kindergarten will receive in person instruction on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday.

-Beginning the week of November 16th, AM Kindergarten will receive in person instruction on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday. PM Kindergarten will receive remote instruction on Wednesday afternoon, and in person instruction on Thursday and Friday.

-Students who receive fully remote instruction will follow the schedule based on their AM or PM placement.

Grades 1-5 Elementary Schools:

-On November 9th, our B cohort students will come to school and our A cohort students will learn virtually.

-On November 16th, our A cohort students will come to school and our B cohort students will learn virtually.

-On November 19th, we will move to Plan A with all students in our elementary schools attending per the new schedule.

CMS:

-On November 9th, CMS will begin the extended school day of 8:15-1:00 PM and begin the 6 period rotate and drop. Our B cohort students will come to school and our A cohort students will learn virtually.

GL:

-On November 9th, GL will begin the 6 period rotate and drop schedule with all students attending virtually until November 19th.

-On November 19th, our Cohort A students will come to school, while our B cohort students will continue to learn virtually.

As always, we will continue to work closely with the Department of Health to monitor the outbreak. We wish everyone a speedy recovery. It is our sincerest wish that our schools will return to normal soon.
