Berkeley Heights, NJ (February 7, 2017). --The Berkeley Heights Environmental Commission wants residents to pledge their commitment to protecting the environment

“We know that many residents support the environment by recycling plastic and paper, composting, and other activities,” said Environmental Commissioner Kinan Tadmori. “We want to challenge them to do more and document the actions they already do by asking them to take a short survey, pledging their support.”

Notices will go out soon asking residents to take an online survey and indicate what measures they already take or would like to take to protect the environment and live a more "green" life. “If we collect surveys from at least 335 residents,” she said, “this action will help us toward reaching Sustainable Jersey Silver Certification. This is not an advertising promotion: residents’ names and addresses will be kept confidential. We hope to have a large turnout to support our effort.”
